Year 3 Curriculum Letter Spring Term



Welcome back!

We hope you had an exciting break. Our topic this term is the **Ancient Egyptians.**

This booklet will explain what your child will be learning over the coming weeks and how you can support their progress at home. We are really looking forward to continuing to work with you this term.

Maths



In maths, we will be focusing on multiplication and division. The children will be given word problems to solve using methods they have learnt in class. Your child should now know their 2x, 3x, 4x, 8x and 10x tables confidently. If your child is not confident with any of these, please practise with them.

We will also be looking at money, measurement and fractions. You can help your child by giving them coins and notes to add. Encourage them to add it mentally and start from the largest number e.g.

20p+20p+2p+1p. Children could also practise using a ruler to measure objects in mm and cm at home.

Writing

In writing, we will be concentrating on writing narratives and explanations. The children will be using their creative writing skills to tell stories. Reading lots of books will help them with vocabulary and ideas for their own stories. We will also look at writing used to explain and create our own piece of explanation writing.

Reading

Reading books will be changed once a week.

Regular reading is vital to your child becoming a confident writer so please ensure vou are reading with them everyday.



Grammar and Punctuation

In grammar, we will focusing on using fronted adverbials. Fronted adverbials are words or phrases that go at the beginning of sentences and explain where, when, how often or manner. Examples include: In the daytime, By the fire, Most of the time. We will also continue our work on subordinating conjunctions such as: when, that, if, until, whereas.

Science

In science, we will be focusing on plants. Children will be identifying and describing the functions of different parts of flowering plants: roots, stem, leaves and flowers. They will be exploring the requirements of plants for life and growth (air, light, water, nutrients from soil, and room to grow) and how they vary from plant to plant. We will also be investigating the way in which water is transported within plants as well as exploring the part that flowers play in the life cycle of flowering plants, including pollination, seed formation and seed dispersal.

Religious Education

Our religious education focus this term will be to reflect. Children will be showing an understanding that personal experiences and feelings influence attitudes and actions. They will be able to given reasons about why religious figures may have acted as they did. They will also be asking questions that have 30 no universally agreed answers.





The focus in history is to investigate and interpret the Ancient

Egyptians. Children will be able to use evidence to ask questions and find answers to questions about the past. They will also be able to suggest causes and consequences of some of the main events and changes in history. Children will learn about the different ways of life during this time period and compare with what they have learned already about the Stone Age.

Art

In art, children will be learning to sketch. We will use various sketching techniques such as cross hatching and stippling to create different lines and effects. We will use our sketching skills to create portraits in the style of Ancient Egyptian artwork.

Geography

We will be learning about rivers in Geography and how they are formed. We will also focus on comparing famous rivers, such as the Nile and the Thames, and will investigate their similarities and differences, both now and historically. There will also be a field trip to observe the nearby River Rea.

Brilliant Beginning

Children will make their own papyrus paper and learn about Ancient Egyptian hieroglyphics.

Fabulous Finish

This will take place during a Parent workshop this term. More details to follow.
